ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Chief and Clerk of Fire Department.

NEWMARKET, N. H., Feb. 15, 1907.

TO THE TOWN OF NEWMARKET:

In compliance with the law, requiring the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department to make an annual report to the town, the following report is respectfully submitted.

FORCE OF THE DEPARTMENT.

The regular force of the department consists of a chief and three assistant chief engineers, two hose companies of 16 men each, one hook and ladder company of 12 men, and a driver for hose wagon No. 3. Each company is allowed to have five substitute members, who, when acting as such, are paid for their services by their principals.

FIRE APPARATUS.

One hose wagon; one double runner hose pung; two two-wheel hose carts; one hook and ladder truck; 2500 feet 2½ inch rubber-lined, knit hose; 1000 feet 2-inch rubber-lined hose; nine flexible play pipes; two two-to-one Siamese connections; one one-to-two Siamese connection; four Callahan shut-off nozzles; four solid play pipes; three chemical extinguishers; two single hydrant gates; 32 spanners; seven hydrant wrenches; eight lanterns; two torches; two crowbars; 12 shovels; five hoes; four fire axes; three coats; 18 fire hats.

The Gleason & Bailey steel frame truck carries one 45-foot East Somerville extension ladder; one 26-foot, one 25-foot, one 24-foot and one 18-foot single ladders; one pull-down hook and chain; four hand hooks; two erotch poles; two fire axes; two crowbars; two sledges; 200 feet of rope; four lanterns; one signal lamp; two torches; one 13-inch gong. There are also held in reserve one 30-foot, one 25-foot and two roof ladders.

FIRE ALARM.

One 2000 lb. bell and striker, in steel tower; two 18-inch gongs; two 8-inch gongs; twelve fire alarm boxes; seven miles of wire, and the proper amount of battery to sustain the same.

APPARATUS.

Our apparatus stands practically as last year, and is in equally as good condition.

REPAIRS.

The repairs on the apparatus during the year were confined to the general wear and tear, no extensive repairs being made. The fire alarm system requires more repairs than in years past, owing to the age of the poles and wire.

WATER SYSTEM.

This system includes 57 two-way hydrants. The water supply has been found ample for our needs and given us good pressure whenever wanted.

GENERAL REMARKS.

It will be seen by the clerk's report that the total amount of fire loss the past year was \$2015; insurance paid on same, \$2015.

The report also shows that the whole number of bell alarms was four, there having been six still alarms for chimney fires, where, by prompt work with the hand extingishers, much property was protected.

In comparing this unusual small loss of property with the many thousand dollars' worth of property at hazard, some little credit must be given to our firemen. For better results, or more willing service, will be found nowhere.

We have made arrangements with the New England Telegraph and Telephone Co. to have them reserve space for a cross arm at the top of all their newly erected poles, to be used for fire alarm purposes. As their poles now cover or will soon cover all the territory now covered by the fire alarm poles and wires, we would advise that in the near future arrangements be made to change to their poles, thus reducing the expense of maintaining this branch of the system.

DIRECTIONS FOR RINGING IN AN ALARM.

When a fire breaks out the person discovering it should immediately run to the box *nearest the fire*, break the glass in the front of the small key box which is on the side of the fire alarm box, take out the key, which is attached to a chain, unlock the fire alarm box, open the door and pull down the hook as far as it will go, then let go the hook. Stand by box to direct the firemen. Don't pull in an alarm for a fire seen at a distance or out of reach of the hydrant system, but notify some member of the department, who will give the proper alarm.

FIRE DEPARTMENT SIGNALS.

Second alarm, 8 blows, for reserve apparatus and call firemen.

2 blows after fire alarm indicates fire all out.

2-2-2. Engineers' call; companies assemble at stations and await orders.

3-3. Hose 3 call. For chimney fires, etc.

4-4-4. Call to Newmarket Manufacturing Co.'s hose company for assistance.

U. S. Observatory standard time, by Western Union Telegraph, one blow at 12.30 Р. м., daily.

Hook and Ladder Co. and Hose 3 will answer all box calls.

Hose I will answer boxes 12, 21, 32, 34, 41, 45 and 49, with apparatus.

Hose 2 will answer boxes 5, 7, 21, 63, 65 and 82, with apparatus.

PUBLIC LIBRARY.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES.

At the March election in 1906, the town raised and appropriated the sum of \$300.00, which, with a like sum donated by the Newmarket Manufacturing Company, was used to repair the public library building, better known as John Webster Hall. Both sums, together with an addition of \$6,68, have been expended under the jurisdiction of Mr. William H. Garner, agent of the company. The building has been thoroughly overhauled, new floors laid, and to-day the building is in first-class repair. The trustees of the library believe that some arrangement ought to be made whereby the building could be better heated, and note with pleasure the article which appears in the town warrant of this year asking for an appropriation for that purpose. Could the building be continuously heated through the winter months, more use of it would be made, and the Woman's Club, the patrons of the library, together with such others as cared to avail themselves of the opportunities presented, would be better served. It is now well lighted; to be well heated and well taken care of, we would then have a public library which would be a credit to our town. If more interest could be aroused, interest by the reading, thinking and intelligent people, a greater demand would be made for the standard works and best fiction, of which we have a goodly number. We earnestly ask the hearty support of all to make the public library what it should be in the fullest sense of the term.
