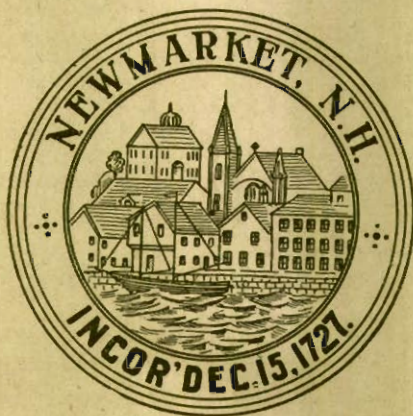

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket qualified to vote in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To choose three members of the Constitutional Convention, as provided by Chapter 121 of the Laws of 1917.

Art. 3. To elect by ballot one trustee as required by Chapter 162 of the Laws of 1915, being an act in relation to trust funds held by cities and towns.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to sprinkle, oil, re-surface or repair its macadamized streets.

Art. 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of state and county taxes, for building and repairing bridges, for laying out and repairing highways, for extinguishing fires, for the support of schools, for the maintenance of the public library, for the care of the cemetery, for lighting the streets and public buildings, for paying town officers, for the support of the poor, for the payment of bonds and interest on the town debt, and for other necessary charges arising within the town.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to extend the sewer to a point opposite to the dwelling house owned by Mrs. Francena Elkins.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to help control the white pine blister rust.

Art. 8. To see what action the town will take in reference to a contract with the Newmarket Electric Company.

Art. 9. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 10. To see if the town will ratify, confirm and approve the action of the Board of Water Commissioners in selling and conveying to the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company for \$200.00 a certain right to erect, operate and maintain lines of telephone and telegraph, including the necessary poles and fixtures, upon and over a certain parcel of land in the town of Newmarket, bounded northerly by land of Walter B. Greene; easterly by land of Paul W. Wiggin; southerly by land formerly of one E. S. Carpenter; westerly by land of Fred W. Knight. Such rights being more particularly described in the deed of such Board to said Company, dated November 13, 1917.
